

- Set up by EU Regulation (Treaty) and financed by EU budget
- Subject to EU financial and staff rules
- Subject to EP, Council, ECA scrutiny under budget discharge procedure



Relations with EC



How do agencies promote cooperation in the EU?

A concrete example from the 2020-2021 pandemic:

- European Medicines Agency (EMA) was requested to analyze and authorize the different vaccines
- European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) intervention to facilitate the authorization procedures for disinfectant products
- **EFSA** was requested to analyze the possibility of COVID transmission through food

EU Reg. 178/2002 – EU General Food Law, following a series of food crises in Europe


Main features:

- Clear separation between assessment (science) and management (policy) functions
- Codified principles and rules: Science- and risk-based policies/decisions, Precautionary principle, Integrated approach, Transparency, Industry responsibility, Traceability
- New crisis management tool: Rapid Alert System on Food and Feed
- Creation of EFSA






Chemicals: 50% less pesticides



Soil: 50% less nutrient losses, 20% less fertilizers



Antimicrobials: 50% less for animal/fish farming



Organic farming: 25% of farmed land, increase in aquaculture

INDEPENDENCE

From risk managers (institutional independence)

From private interests (individual independence)

Guaranteed through a policy covering all actors and working processes:

- Transparency of data and processes
- Ownership of opinions: panels of experts on individual capacity
- Governance of scientific processes: mandates, selection of experts, collegial decision making, transparency
- Management of interests: conflict of interest definition, "cooling-off" and "revolving-doors" periods/procedures, declarations and screening of interests' procedures, transparency
